
Bonjour Blair Stars!

Goldfish Letter Trace



Questions to ask

On each page ask: "Where is the little fish? Point to it!" and "Where is the big fish? Point to it!"

This is a great way to practice big and small/little.

You can use cupcake liners and paper plates to make a fish!





Who lives at the aquarium?

What colors do you see? Point to red! Point to yellow! Point to Blue!

Find a big fish.

Find a small fish.

You can ask these questions and answer them aloud to help your student practice vocabulary and identifying.


Ocean Foam

Where is the shark? Point to it!

Where is the crab? Point to it!

Where is the whale? Point to it!


